

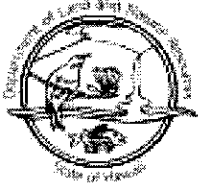

Dear Mr. Hay, Jr.:

Thank you for your letter of December 5, 2003. All cabin lots are in the resource subzone of the Conservation District. Therefore, any lessee who wishes to demolish, remove, or alter any improvements must first obtain a Conservation District Use permit from the department.

Pursuant to section 13-5-22, Hawai'i Administrative Rules (HAR), a Departmental permit is required for the demolition, removal, or alteration of existing structures, facilities, and equipment. The department will evaluate any historic property for historical significance. An application for a Departmental permit along with a \$50. application fee should be filed with the Land Division who oversees the administration of those rules.
